NWHS Principal's Message

The increase in traffic around Sedalia tells me that the Missouri State Fair has started, which means another school year is almost upon us. I was once told that a new school year is an opportunity. It is a time of fresh beginnings and clean slates. A new school year is not only a time of new beginnings for students, but for parents, teachers, and the many other individuals that has a hand in a student's education. I am thoroughly excited for a new school year. There has been many important changes in staff and policy which I am sure will result in a better experience for not only students, but for parents/guardians as well.

As you know, communication is a vital part of your student's success here at Northwest High School. It takes parents, students, and teachers working together to ensure a suitable learning environment for all students. We will continue to send home progress reports every 2 weeks. **The first progress report will be sent home Friday, September 11th** and one will follow every other Friday until the end of the school year. Just like last year, the reports will need to be signed by the parent/guardian and returned. Failure to do so will result in detention for the student and communication with the parent/guardian. As always, I strongly encourage you to reach out to teachers or myself when you see issues.

As I mentioned, there will be some changes this year that we are excited about. First, all students will be issued a daily planner. This planner will need to be carried by the student **at all times**. It is an excellent way for students to help organize their many activities and responsibilities. It is also another way that we would like to communicate with parents. It is our hope that the planner will be a way for the parent/guardian to see homework responsibilities along with other important information. **Losing a planner will result in a \$6.50 replacement fee.**

Some other changes include:

A new attendance policy which states a student shall be allowed no more than eight (8) absences. There are no more excused vs. unexcused absences. An absence is an absence. On the ninth (9) absence, in any one class, the student will not earn credit for that class unless time is made up. Students will have the opportunity to work with the administration to make up any missed time over the 8 allowed absences prior to the end of the semester through Saturday school sessions. When a student will be absent, it is still the parent's responsibility to contact the office. Exceptional and extenuating circumstances will be considered.

A new eligibility policy which states that **Athletes and students representing the school in the community in ALL activities must be good students.** High school athletes and participants (grades 9-12) must have successfully completed courses earning a minimum of **3.0 credits and maintain a (C+) average (2.3 on 4.0 scale)** in the preceding semester and must be enrolled in courses earning minimum of 3.0 credits in the current semester. Athletes and participants in grades 7-8 must be enrolled in a normal course load, **maintain a (C+) average (2.3 on 4.0 scale)**, and have been promoted at the end of the previous year. **If credits are maintained students may re-instate eligibility by meeting the C+ average at mid-term.**

Every change was done with the best interest of students in mind and the goal to provide students with the best learning environment possible. As always, my door is open for any conversation you would like to have. I value the opportunity to work with your children and yourself in order to prepare all students for success.

We hope to see everyone at Orientation which will be Tuesday, August 25 from 6pm to 7pm where students will be able to pick up their schedules and all teachers will be available to visit with students and parents.
